**ABOUT EAA106** -- EAA106 is the largest chapter in New England (182 members in MA, NH, RI, & CT - as of 12/31/07) of the Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA), and probably one of the most active, too. While it's called the "Greater Boston" chapter, we like to think it now means "Greater than just Boston" since ~10% of our organization live in NH and others live as far south as Cape Cod and west to Sturbridge, MA. With a chapter motto of "We Build Airplanes", more than 60 members built, fly, or are building kit/plans built aircraft. About 50 members own or rent certified aircraft or fly professionally. Members include pilots (range of all ratings from PSEL to ATP), student pilots, & many with aviation dreams. Some members are CFIs and some A&Ps or AIs. Several members are military aviation veterans -- WWII, Korea, Vietnam, Gulf War, etc. EAA106 hosts monthly aviation presentations, hosts an annual fly-in with ~ a dozen seminars (**Jul 12, 2008**), flies youth (ages 8-17) for free as "Young Eagles", and hosts B-17 (**Aug 15-17, 2008** [www.B17.org](http://www.B17.org)) and 1929 Ford Tri-Motor (**Sep. 18-21, 2008** [www.FlyTheFord.org](http://www.FlyTheFord.org)) New England tour stops at Lawrence Municipal Airport (LWM), No. Andover, MA. Our hangar is also located at LWM. EAA106 is a non-profit organization registered in MA and a member of the Merrimack Valley Chamber of Commerce. **Bring a friend!
