B) Resume and extracurricular activities

C) Essay – A personal statement – not to exceed 500 words

As part of your application for the EAA106 Student Scholarship, you will need to write a double-spaced, typewritten essay not to exceed 500 words describing: Why you want to attend EAA's Advanced Air Academy; How this Academy will help to develop your interest in aviation; What aviation experiences, education, or training you have to date; and Why you should be selected for this scholarship.

D) One (1) letter of recommendation

This letter must be from an adult who is not part of your family. The letter must include their contact information should our EAA106 Scholarship Selection Committee (SSC) wish to contact them.

E) Copy of most recent, official high school (or 1st year college) grades

Include a copy of your latest grades. We're not requiring straight A's, but grades will be considered as part of our selection criteria.
