WHAT IS EAA?

EAA, the Experimental Aircraft Association, is the Leader in Recreational Aviation and an international organization of over 170,000 members with a wide range of aviation interests and backgrounds. EAA, founded in 1953 by a group of individuals who were interested in building their own airplanes, has expanded its mission through the decades to include antiques, classics, warbirds, aerobatic aircraft, ultralights, helicopters and contemporary manufactured aircraft. **You don't have to be a pilot or aircraft owner to be a member of EAA.** If you have dreamed of flying, but didn't realize you could participate, you are invited to join EAA. **Whether you are interested in building, buying or owning an airplane; seeing the world's greatest air show performers; meeting aviation personalities; or just enjoy being around airplanes . . .** *EAA is the place for you.*

EAA106 sounds great!

I'm ready to join!

How do I join EAA106?

GREAT ! – **Fill out the application form (on our website)** and mail (along with a check for your dues made **payable to EAA106**) – Send to our Treasurer: **Angier Ames, PO Box 430, Hamilton, MA 01936.** If you're not yet a member of EAA National, you'll also need to join them – Don't delay – join BOTH at the same time.

So I need to join EAA National, too? Why?

YES – EAA, our parent organization requires that all members of any EAA chapter belong to EAA National (and remain current). While EAA106 receives no money from EAA HQ and operates solely on our own dues and fundraisers, EAA National provides our insurance at a fraction of the normal price which allows us to hold many events (such as our fly-in). EAA is the Leader in Recreational Aviation – worth supporting!

Do I need to join EAA before I join EAA106?

NO – While you do need to join EAA National, **you may join EAA (1-800-JOIN-EAA) & EAA106 at the SAME TIME.**

But we would appreciate you making sure you **tell EAA National that you are joining them because you are joining EAA106** (they give EAA106 a tiny rebate). Thanks!

Who are EAA106 Members?

Almost **70 members built, fly, or are building kit/plans built aircraft** while over **50 members own, rent or fly certified aircraft.** Some members are CFIs and some A&Ps or AIs.

What does EAA106 do?

EAA106 hosts interesting aviation presentations, hosts a fly-in with ~ a dozen seminars, flies youth (8-17) for free as “Young Eagles”, and hosts B-17 and 1929 Ford Tri-Motor New England tour stops at Lawrence Municipal Airport (LWM). Our hangar (and workshop with many tools) is also at LWM.

Do I have to build (or plan to build) my own aircraft to join EAA106?

NO – While our chapter motto is “**WE BUILD PLANES**” and we would **LOVE** to have even more members building, only about 1/3 of our membership has built or is presently building (or flying) their own homebuilt aircraft.

We encourage the building of homebuilt aircraft, especially through our fly-in, seminars, & programs throughout the year.
